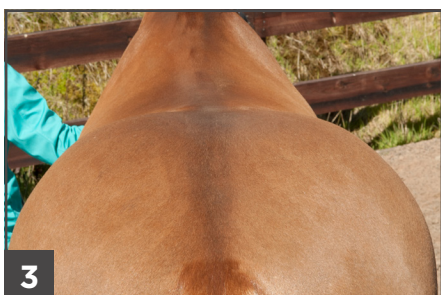
PHOTOGRAPHS



Take a side on picture with the horse filling the full frame from nose to tail.



Take a side on in the area where the saddle sits.



Carefully stand up behind your horse and hold the camera about 18" back from the top of the tail and 12" about top of the tail. This will show the back from above. Please be careful not to get kicked by the horse.



Stand beside the horse's head on the near side and take a picture pointing towards the wither and shoulder showing the area where the saddle sits from a front view.



Do the same shot again (step 4) but from the off side.

MEASUREMENTS

To take a measurement of your horses wither, all you need is either a piece of wire (about 20" long) or a flexicurve (bought from eBay or a stationery shop).

1. Simply bend the wire or flexicurve over your horses back just behind the wither, 4cm behind the scapula (shoulder blade) at the point where the front of the saddle will sit. Make sure it is pressed firmly to shape.
2. Then transfer this shape onto an A4 piece of paper which can be scanned and emailed or faxed to us.
